Mr. Neuhoff is Vice President of Business Development for Covanta Energy, focused on public and private partnerships, procurements of greenfield Energy-from-Waste (EfW) projects, due diligence and acquisition of existing EfW and complementary assets to Covanta's base business. He is very active in the Canadian market where he led the development efforts on the Durham York Energy Centre, North America's first commercial greenfield EfW facility in 15 years. Covanta is the design, build, operator of the \$255M plant located in Clarington, Ontario.

In April 2012, Mr. Neuhoff was appointed to a two year term on the Ontario Waste Management Association (OWMA) Board of Directors. In December 2012, he was re-appointed to the inaugural U.S. Government's Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Advisory Committee.

Mr. Neuhoff came to Covanta in January, 2008 after serving 2 ½ years as a political appointee in the George W. Bush Administration where he ran the Office of Energy and Environmental Industries at the Department of Commerce. His efforts centered on removing trade barriers and improving U.S. competitiveness. At Commerce, he focused on policies to enhance international trade of U.S. goods and services in the energy and environmental sector, and specifically designed, led and participated in multiple clean energy trade missions to China, India, and Southeast Asia.

Prior to joining the Administration, Joey was a senior manager for a privately held Dallas manufacturer and metal fabricator of industrial weldments and specialty equipment. He also managed a small oil and gas exploration and production company in Houston. He has a BA in Government from the University of Texas - Austin and a MBA from the University of Dallas. Joey is married, has two children and lives in Morristown, NJ.
